



## **ULI Minnesota Committees and Panels Volunteer Opportunities**



ULI Minnesota's mission is to engage public and private sector leaders to foster collaboration, share knowledge and join in meaningful strategic action to create thriving, resilient communities.

Members can get involved by attending any of our local events (<u>see calendar</u>), becoming active on one of our local committees, or being a panelist or facilitator.

## **Committees:**

- **Healthy and Resilient Communities Initiative:** Shaping actions and projects and places in ways that support healthy and resilient communities with a particular focus on climate, land use and energy.
- Housing Initiative: Partnering to implement tools and strategies that support a full range of housing choices.
- Young Leaders Group (YLG): Increase membership and involvement by professionals and students under age 35 by planning and coordinating events and programs.
- Next 10: Provide high-value, relationship-driven small groups to connect mid-career professionals (over age 35) committed to intentional long-term leadership and support for peers.
- **UrbanPlan:** Recruit teachers and schools to host the Urban Plan program and organize trainings for teachers and facilitators for a classroom-based program in which high school students learn the roles, issues, trade-offs, and economics involved in urban development.

## Panels:

- Navigating Your Competitive Future: A workshop that offers a practical approach to the new
  challenges of development and redevelopment in cities. It is designed to foster a dialogue about
  the opportunities and challenges inherent in an economy based upon changing shifts in the
  market.
- **Technical Assistance Program (TAP):** Assist local governments or non-profits on a specific land use project by bringing a ULI Minnesota team of experts to a 1.5 to 2 day session. Solicit and select communities and/or projects, serve on panels and produce the report.
- **UrbanPlan:** Volunteer to be a facilitator or juror in a classroom-based, web-supported program in which high school students learn the roles, issues, trade-offs, and economics involved in urban development.
